We only mark those if we are sure of their death. Many of the names in red may have passed on, but we have not found anyone to verify the death.




What wonderful memories!!



A retired bank vice president, Fisher worked for 35 years for Bank of Louisville and BB&T, which acquired the Louisville bank in 2002. He was a former volunteer for the Kentucky Derby Festival's Pegasus Parade and poster premiere committees, a graduate of Leadership Louisville and a member of Citizens for Better Judges' citizens review board.

"He loved his family very much. He was always there for us," said son Paul Fisher. Marvin Fisher's wife, Candace, said her husband was "a great, great man."

A neighbor of both victims, Mahmoud Hindi, has been charged with the shooting and is jailed on a \$1 million bond. He had a longrunning dispute with the association involving a fence and driveway at his home.

Fisher attended Thursday's meeting because he was a board member of the association, his family said.

Earlier Sunday, members of the Spring Creek subdivision came together for an informal prayer vigil at Springdale Community Church, seeking solace after the shootings.

Jeremy White, the executive pastor, said residents responded to the church's invitation to pray together Sunday.

"We're here to minister to them in whatever way we can," he said.

The theme of Sunday's vigil was solidarity and the start of healing, White said.

"The message today is that our church is praying for the people of Spring Creek and especially the victims, those who were most deeply and clearly affected by this.

"He sort of liked to find the humor in most any situation," Steinbock

Dan Goyette, chief public defender for the Louisville public defender's office and a past chairman of Citizens for Better Judges, said Fisher was a "very caring, civic-minded individual who was committed to ensuring a high quality judiciary in this community."

"Even though his background was in banking, not law, he was dedicated to the mission of (Citizens for Better Judges) and gave generously of his time and insight to improve our court system by electing the best qualified candidates," Goyette said. "We will miss his leadership and his significant contributions to the organization."

In addition to Fisher's wife and son, his survivors include a daughter-in-law, Lindsey, and granddaughters Anna, 3, and Sara, 3 months.

"Our message always, every Sunday, is that our hope is in Jesus Christ, and we want to offer that same hope to the people who were so clearly affected by this."

Hindi's wife and children were among those at the vigil, said Jason Autry, the church's lead pastor.

They were welcomed with open arms by community and church members, which was a powerful sight, Autry said. "It was moving."

Like everyone at the service, the Hindis were just looking for answers, Autry said. Hindi's family members "were very gracious," he said. "And very broken, and certainly just trying to make sense of it all."

Autry was upset later Sunday to learn that Fisher had died, saying Fisher's sister-in-law attended the morning vigil and said his condition was improving. He remembered Fisher as a "kind man" who was passionate about his neighborhood.

Fisher was a member of Hurstbourne Christian Church, where the Rev. Mike Gatton said Fisher volunteered on an administrative committee and was known for his love of food.

"His favorite thing was eating. He absolutely loved fellowship meals," Gatton said.

Wendy Jacob, a vice president and regional employment manager for BB&T, said Fisher trained her in the early 1990s at a bank branch on Whittington Parkway. He was a meticulous worker and instructive teacher who frequently hosted meetings in a community room at the bank.

"He was always willing to give the client what they needed, always went above and beyond," she said.

Jacob, who is head of the Derby Festival's board of directors, said Fisher helped inspire her enthusiasm for community involvement.

Steinbock, who later worked on Leadership Louisville with Fisher, remembered his friend as a loyal Bank of Louisville and BB&T employee who was always smiling.

LOUISVILLE, KY. (WDRB) — The wife of one of the men shot inside a Louisville church last week says the community has lost a great man. Marvin Fisher passed away Sunday morning at University Hospital.

WDRB's Tarnara Evans sat down with his wife, who says she had a feeling something was wrong Thursday evening. Candace Fisher says her husband was on the Board of Directors for the Spring Creek Homeowners Association, and was a past president. She never imagined that an HOA meeting, would turn violent.

69-year-old Marvin Fisher was critically injured that evening when police say 55year-old Mahmoud Hindi shot Fisher and another man over a property dispute. The other man, 73-year-old David Merritt, was the president of the Homeowners Association and died from his injuries.

Candace Fisher was holding out hope that her husband would survive the shooting. On Thursday evening, when she realized what happened nearby at Springdale Community Church, she went there hoping to find her husband.

She says, "I saw two ambulances leave at that time and in my heart I knew my husband was in one of those ambulances. You just know these things somehow, I guess."

When asked, "You just had a feeling?" she replied, "Yes, and it's really great they took him there because I used to work at University Hospital and I got so much support when I was in the hospital with all the nurses and people I used to work with coming up to the floor and hugging me and telling me how sorry they were."

Fisher is planning a celebration of life for her husband this Saturday at 11:00 a.m. at Hurstbourne Christian Church. She's asking people to wear bright colors to remember him.

As for David Merritt, his visitation was Monday at Evergreen Funeral Home.

Mahmoud Hindi is in jail on a \$1 million bond, and police say is expected to face another murder charge.





Lawyer Richard Shapero dies; he challenged attorney advertising laws and won

Personal injury lawyer Richard Shapero, best known for his U.S. Supreme Court case establishing laws regarding lawyer advertising, died at his Louisville home Sunday.

Shapero, 63, challenged Kentucky's prohibition against targeted direct mailings in 1985, when the state's Supreme Court refused to let him send letters to homeowners facing foreclosures.

In its 1988 ruling in Shapero vs. Kentucky Bar Association, the U.S. Supreme Court said that states like Kentucky violated the right of free speech when they banned lawyers from soliciting business through truthful letters to people with particular legal needs.

"He had a profound effect on the law and on attorneys across the U.S.," said Jodie Riebel, Shapero's girlfriend and an attorney for the U.S. Enrichment Corp. in Paducah. She said it appears Shapero died of a heart attack.

"He was one of the first attorneys in Louisville to do a lot of saturation advertising," said Robert Ewald, president of the Kentucky Bar Association. Ewald was head of the Kentucky Attorneys' Advertising Commission when the bar lost the Supreme Court decision.

"There was nothing mean-spirited about Dick. He was a good-hearted, decent guy," Ewald said. "He had his opinion about advertising, and he fought for his position and won."

Shapero's daughter, Annie Rose Shapero, said her father put a lot of zest into everything he did.

"He was audacious. He had lots of chutzpah," she said. "He loved what he did. He loved helping people, striking a good deal."

Amy Arthur, who had been his secretary for nearly eight years, said Shapero was open with all of his clients and colleagues and always let his assistants speak their minds.

Shapero was host of a law talk show on WAVG-970 AM in the late 1980s and once sued the city of Louisville for removing several benches bearing the name of his practice after it called them "visual clutter" in the public right of way.

In 1991, Shapero tried getting around the city's rules by attaching a cup for bench-sitters to drop in coins. "I have a vending machine. It vends seats," Shapero quipped at the time. He went back and forth with the city about his benches for several years. One of the benches still faces Sixth Street near Market Street with an arrow pointing to his office on an upper floor.

Riebel said Shapero was a "neat guy" with a great sense of humor and was one of the most ethical attorneys she had ever met.

"I've never met an attorney who would not disclose a client's name or who would not tell you facts about some juicy person that they were representing, except Richard. Not a word. Not a word," she said.

Alexander 'Sandy' Speer, who helped put Actors Theatre on path to prominence, dies

Alexander "Sandy" Speer, a fixture of Actors Theatre of Louisville for 40 years, died of an apparent heart attack at his home in Goshen early Friday morning, said his sister, Marty Wyle.

He was 67.

Speer retired as executive director of the theater in 2006 following the conclusion of the 30th Humana Festival of New American Plays. He stepped down shortly after learning he had Parkinson's disease, said Wyle, a nurse who lives in Los Angeles.

Speer's death came as a surprise, as he appeared to be managing the disease well and had just spent the holidays in California, his sister said.

Speer joined Actors in 1965 and was promoted to general manager in 1969. At age 25, he was "one of the youngest general managers in the 30-odd regional theaters in the country," according to a Courier-Journal account from the time.

Jon Jory, who worked with Speer for three decades at Actors, said if not for Speer's leadership, the theater might not even exist today, much less enjoy the same prominence.

"Sandy assumed the financial leadership at

Actors Theatre at absolutely its lowest point," he said. "1969 through 1971 were times when it would have made sense to close the operation."

But Speer's "deep roots in Louisville" and "wonderful web of contacts" helped put the theater back on track, Jory said. In 1972, Actors moved from an abandoned railway station to its current home at 316 W. Main St.

Trish Pugh Jones, another longtime associate of Speer's at Actors, described him as "a consummate gentleman and a wonderful co-worker and a very loving and loyal administrator."

Besides the theater, he loved collecting antiques and "puttering around in his garden" at his house in Goshen, she said.

Jones said Speer also had a "wicked sense of humor that will be sorely missed."

She recalled that years ago, before Actors Theatre had its parking garage, she once

complained to Speer about a deep puddle near her parking spot on Main Street. Speer proceeded to stock the puddle with some small fish and a sign that said "Lake Louisville."

Speer also is survived by his brother, Kent Speer, of Louisville. He never married or had children.

Funeral arrangements are pending, Wyle said.




